GETTING TO NEW ZEALAND

New Zealand is easily accessible from overseas. It is an 11 hour direct flight from most places in the Pacific Rim, including Singapore, Hong Kong, Tokyo and the West Coast of the USA and only a three hour flight for neighbouring Pacific Islands and the eastern seaboard of Australia. New Zealand is serviced by all major airlines including members of Star Alliance, Oneworld and SkyTeam. Auckland offers regular daily flights to all the country's main centres and popular tourist destinations.



Getting around Auckland

Auckland's compact footprint and accessible transport solutions make it an incredibly easy and enjoyable city to get around. This compact nature means guests can feel safe and confident exploring Auckland, and it's easy to walk around the central business district.

Māori culture

Māori are the tangata whenua, the indigenous people of Aotearoa New Zealand, and their culture is an integral part of what makes New Zealand so unique. Guests are presented with diverse opportunities to experience Māori culture first-hand.

Observe Māori culture on a marae, which is a sacred communal meeting space. Visit a marae to experience a traditional Māori welcome, hear Māori speeches and singing, see carved meeting houses, greet locals with a hongi (pressing of noses) and enjoy a Hāngi feast cooked in a traditional earth oven – food infused with a smoky, earthy fragrance.

Enjoy the kapa haka, a performance that incorporates harmonious singing and rhythmic dancing, and includes the skilled demonstrations of the poi and traditional weaponry. The haka is the spine tingling war dance which is a must-see whilst in New Zealand.

Get hands-on with guided workshops, learning the basic techniques of traditional art including flax weaving, poi making and bone carving under the expert guidance of established Māori artists.

Sailing & cruising

Host of the 36th America's Cup in 2021 and known as the 'City of Sails', Auckland is the ultimate sailing destination.

Discover the excitement of sailing an America's Cup vessel across the Waitematā Harbour. With guidance from crew, become part of

a racing team. Take the helm to help steer on course or exert energy on the grinders to hoist the mainsail during this hands-on sailing adventure. Voyage on a traditional waka hourua (canoe), an ancient craft that carried the first settlers to New Zealand. This sailing experience encourages guests to get amongst the crew, learn how to operate the waka, use traditional navigation techniques and hear about the history of the waka.

Island adventures

Waiheke Island is the jewel in Auckland's crown. See why Lonely Planet calls it one of the world's top 10 regions to visit. Just a 35minute ferry ride from downtown Auckland, Waiheke Island is home to more than 30 wineries and vineyards, olive groves, golden sand beaches and an active artistic community. Sample award winning wines, set amongst the groves and relax over a delicious vineyard lunch.

For the more adventurous, try horse riding, sea kayaking, fishing, archery, and laser pigeon shooting. Join a walking tour, take a scenic flight by helicopter or seaplane or soar across the treetops on a flying fox zipline.



Auckland art





Explore a little further afield

Visit some must-see attractions all a short drive from Auckland's city centre. Experience the real Middle-earth with a visit to the Hobbiton[™] Movie Set, featured in The Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit films. Take a look at Bag End, where Frodo and Bilbo's adventures began. Get lost among the hobbit holes and visit the Green Dragon Inn, the Mill and the Party Tree, listening to spell-binding tales of how Hobbiton came to be.

Further afield, under the green hills of Waitomo lies a labyrinth of caves, sinkholes and underground rivers. The easiest way to see the Waitomo Caves is with a walking or boat tour. The more adventurous should try the unique experience of black water rafting - crawl, swim and float through the caves on a rubber tube. Or abseil or zip-line through the darkness exploring an incredible wonder of nature.



From crystal-clear streams and magical forests, to epic biking trails and explosive geysers, Rotorua has it all. The city offers a raft of attractions and experiences for everyone from adventure-seekers to those just looking to unwind. Sitting within the Pacific Rim of Fire, Rotorua is a geothermal wonderland with bubbling mud pools, clouds of steam, and natural hot springs perfect for bathing and relaxing in. After marvelling at the distinctive landscapes and volcanic activity within a geothermal park, enjoy a simple soak in a natural hot stream or indulge in a wellness getaway at a luxurious spa.
