**ESCAPE ROOMS**  
Test your skills at Escape. Get locked in a room, solve the mystery and massmind a way out, all under the relentless tick of the clock.

**ECO-FRIENDLY TOURS**  
Enjoy environmentally-friendly small-group walking tours with Aucky Walks or get on a bike with Adventure Capital. They specialise in privately guided cycling tours around Auckland and Waikato.

**WEIGHTLESS RELAXATION**  
Complete relaxation is achieved when your entire body is weightless, but space travel can be tricky so head to Float Culture instead. Lie in salt-water float pods, void of both noise and light, and feel your every knot and niggle disappear.

**SECRET BARS**  
Hidden behind an odd assortment of framed photos on Karangahape Rd exists Sly bar. The door is hidden, but perseverance will pay off to reveal a vintage, prohibition-style speakeasy. For the glitterati, Caretaker is modelled on a classic New York cocktail bar and The Jefferson boasts more than 500 whiskeys.

**24 hours in CENTRAL AUCKLAND**

**MORNING**  
Start the day by grabbing a coffee in the seaside suburb of Mission Bay, and then pick up a yellow Onzo Bike. The city's bike sharing scheme is as cheap as \$1 per hour. Cycle along the waterfront and take a detour to Drake Bay Village. Here you'll find a former gin factory now hosting brunch spots and boutique stores. Get stuck into something delicious like Creme Brulee French Toast from Ampers and Eatery.

**MID MORNING**  
Drop by Pandoro bakery in Parnell and choose a few items for a late picnic lunch in the Auckland Domain.

**AFTERNOON**  
As the biggest and oldest park in the city, Auckland Domain is home to the Museum and the Wintergardens, a Victorian-style conservatory crawling with plants and fronted by an elegant courtyard. Find a secluded stretch of lawn for your picnic and then head off in the direction of Grafton Bridge. From here you can drop into Karangahape Rd and spend the afternoon perusing an eclectic collection of one-of-a-kind curiosities. Should you need refreshment, Carmen Jones will provide the sangria, and an interior straight out of Havana.

**BEST ROOFTOP BARS**  
**Vue Bar**  
Take the lift to the very top floor of The Grand Mercure and find Vue Bar and Restaurant. Enormous windows afford spectacular views across downtown Auckland, particularly impressive at night.

**SO/ Auckland**  
Join the flash-pack at SO/ Auckland, a moon-in rooftop bar on the 16th floor of the Sofitel. The balcony provides glittering views across Waitematā Harbour, and the cocktails will knock your socks off.

**The Churchill**  
Choose from 170 different types of gin at The Churchill on the 20th floor of the Four Points by Sheraton. Exuding 1920s glamour, plush velvet and bronze accents abound. Find it on Queen St.

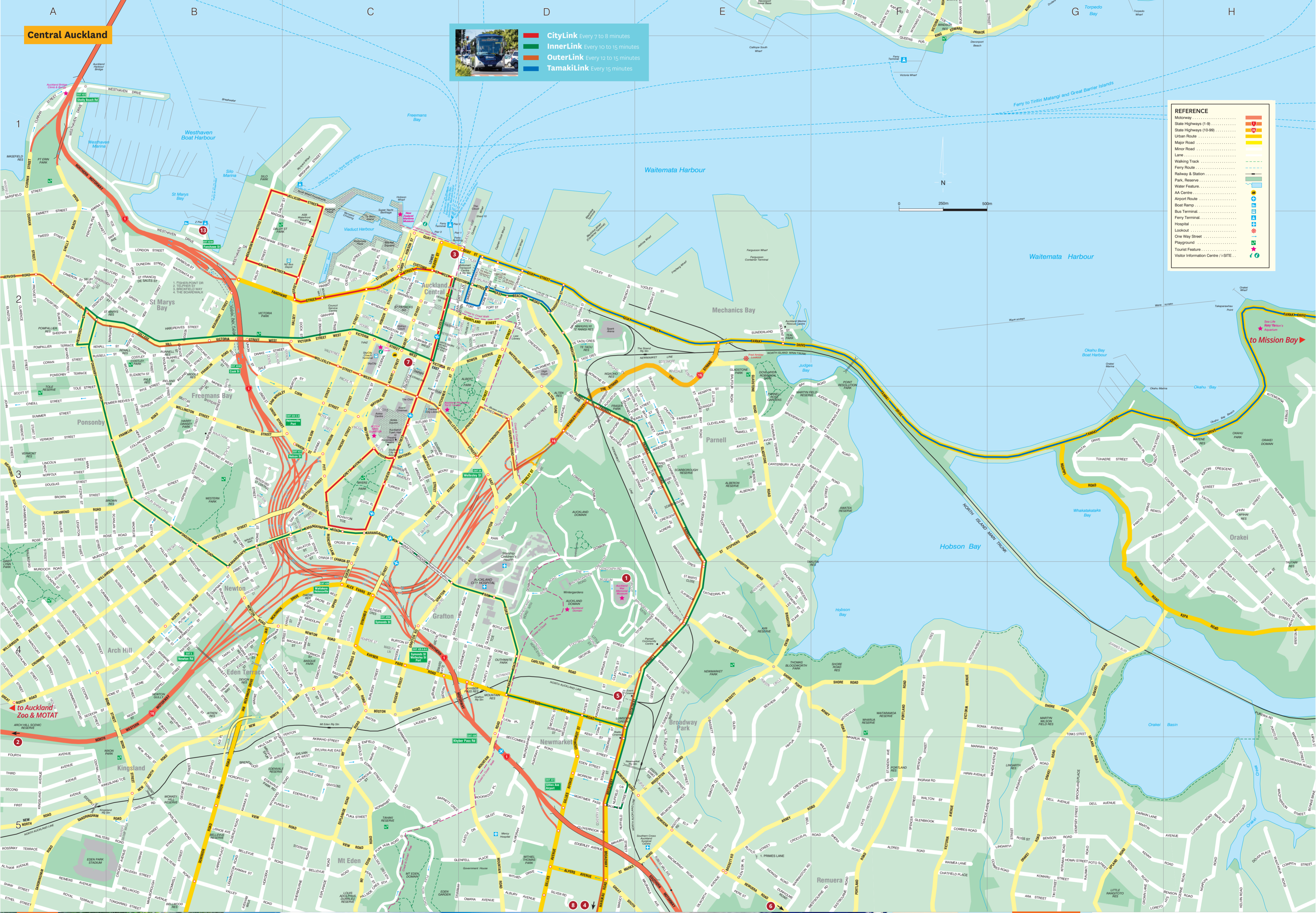

**EVENING**  
With stomachs once again stirring, it's time to find out why New Zealanders love their kaimoana (seafood). The refurbished Auckland Fish Market straddling the Wynyard Quarter is a 96-year-old building with the Sandford & Son fishmonger at its heart, and a dozen new eateries in its grasp. With a décor that channels as much light as possible, there's a distinctly alfresco feel. Dishes are as simplistic as mussels and fries, and as polished as freshly caught lobster.

**cornwall park**  
Cornwall Park is a haven of the green spaces in the heart of Auckland, and its path to nature bliss. Come enjoy the nature, and walk or run to many paths, open lawns and paddocks before ending under your favourite tree. It's the best part of Auckland's landscape over 100 years after being gifted to New Zealanders by Sir James O'Rourke Campbell and his son John that looks after it for you - and the generations to come.

DIVERSITY AND BEAUTY

From the sparkling harbour dotted with treasures to the peaks of volcanoes popping up in between, Auckland is a region of beautiful natural contrast. There are many walking tracks, a wealth of wildlife to spy on, far-flung islands to discover and a sparkling gulf to enjoy. However way you choose to explore, make sure you get out and enjoy nature in Auckland's big backyard.

**CITY BEACHES**  
If you're looking for a beach near the city centre, visit Mission Bay, Kohimarama or St Heliers. Walk, cycle, swim, play beach volleyball, or just eat, drink and watch the world go by.

**TAMAKI DR WATERFRONT**  
Feel like a Sunday stroll (or power walk) along the water's edge? Head along Tamaki Dr from downtown and stop at one of the four beaches along the way. All the views are impressive (sparkling water, city skyline, Rangitoto Island) and if you want to take it up a notch, walk up Bastion Point and take a breather in the gardens at Michael Joseph Savage Memorial Park.

**TOP WALKS**

**PICNIC AT WESTERN SPRINGS PARK**  
Bordering both the Auckland Zoo and the Museum of Transport and Technology (MOTAT), Western Springs Park is the perfect place for a walk or a picnic - playground included. Kids love seeing the swans and ducks on the lake, there are plenty of shaded areas and MOTAT runs a beautiful vintage tram that can be caught from the road for a fun, 15-minute ride. You also won't want to miss over 75 native animals and 100 plant species in Te Wao Nui, the Auckland Zoo's largest habitat project to date.

**MAKE TRACKS**  
Explore rocky coastlines and sheltered bays, lush native forest and wide open countryside, pounding surf and trickling streams, or remote wildlife sanctuaries. Auckland is brimming with fantastic walks - one favourite is the 16km Coast to Coast Walkway that leads from one ocean to another over four to five hours. For walking track information, check out aucklandcouncil.govt.nz.

**WATERFRONT**

**TOP PICKS**

**VOLCANO COUNTRY**  
There are 48 extinct or dormant volcanoes in Auckland, and no visit is complete without scaling at least one - you won't find a better photo opportunity! Take a 25-minute ferry ride from downtown Auckland to Rangitoto Island, climb to the summit of Mt Eden, take a picnic to One Tree Hill or explore the tunnels at North Head.

**TOP CITY PARKS**

- Cornwall Park**  
See farm animals under the huge oak trees in this piece of countryside right in the heart of Auckland city. Open daily from 7am-dusk.
- Albert Park**  
Take a stroll in this inner-city park with its pretty gardens. Neighbouring the University of Auckland and the Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tamaki, this park has earned a special place in the hearts of the locals.
- Auckland Domain**  
At 75 acres, this park is one of Auckland's largest making it great for jogging or walking. It's also home to Auckland War Memorial Museum Tamaki Paenga Hira.

**AUCKLAND DOMAIN WINTERGARDENS**  
Make time for a high tea at the pavilion at the Auckland Domain Wintergardens, a Victorian-style architectural treasure with rare and spectacular plants, pergolas and a beautiful neo-classical courtyard.

**HOP ON A FERRY**  
Take a day trip to Waikato Island which is only a 40-minute ferry ride from the city centre, cruise for 90 minutes to the award-winning Riverhead Tavern, or jump on the Bam ferry to the wildlife sanctuary on Tiritiri Matangi Island.

**SILO PARK**  
A vibrant, welcoming space on the harbour's edge, Silo Park is where free movies are projected onto giant disused silos in summer. There's also a playground with a sandpit, mini-basketball court and water feature where toddlers paddle while adults watch on from the free bean bags.

**JUMP ON BOARD**  
Many places dotted around Auckland's shores hire out paddle boards for some fun on the water. Mission Bay Watersports offers equipment hire, lessons and even paddle board fitness classes. You'll work through yoga, power paddling and exercises, all while balancing on serene waters with stunning Auckland views in the background.

**TAKE A TOUR**  
The best way to really get to know central Auckland from those who know it best is by taking a guided tour. There are a variety on offer, from food and heritage tours to tuk tuk or cycle tours.

**CAST A LINE**  
Try your hand at catching a fish for dinner and join one of the city's many fishing charter experiences. TIME Unlimited Tours offers a world-first experience: kite fishing. The technique allows fish to be caught up to two kilometres offshore by taking the line out on a kite - genius!

**CYCLE THE HOT PINK ROAD**  
Paved in vivid magenta, Te Ara i Whiti is the most colourful cycle path in central Auckland. Its name translates as 'the lightpath', and you'll see why at night when vibrant interactive LED lights follow you as you walk or cycle along this former motorway off-ramp. This has become one of the most popular cycle routes in Auckland, with thousands of keen cyclists and pedestrians using it since it opened in January 2016.

**SET SAIL**  
Auckland is known for its affinity with the surrounding sea, and there's an abundance of yachting experiences available to put this to the test. Explore Grafton has a fleet of large, purpose-built yachts and is known for its sailing and dining cruises on the Waitematā Harbour.

## FESTIVAL FUN

Fun and multicultural celebrations are a summer essential. In January, the **Tāmaki Herenga Waka Festival** tells the story of Auckland's Māori heritage and the waka (canoes) that sailed here, while the annual **SeaPort Festival** honours the rich maritime heritage that followed. Creative eccentricity is key to the **Auckland Fringe Art Festival**, a two-week event hosted in February at more than 50 locations. Also during this month, **Auckland Pride** elevates the city's feel-good vibes, and the equally dazzling **Lantern Festival** takes place in the Auckland Domain. In March, the two-day **Pasifika Festival** takes over Western Springs Park with cultural performances, workshops and Pacific cuisine.

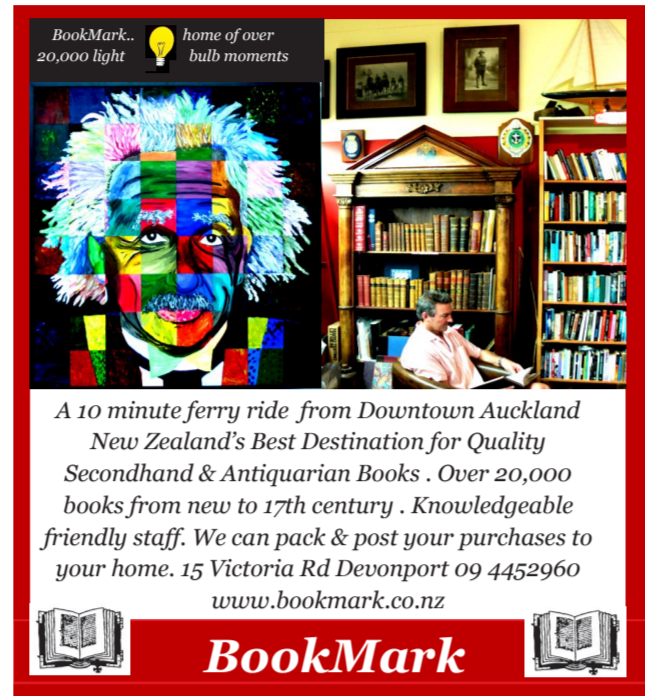

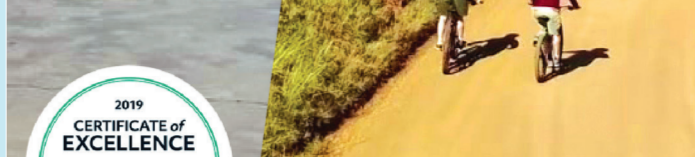
